

Alain Girard

Alain Girard heads the supervision of small banks and securities firms at the Swiss financial market supervisory authority (FINMA). In this function and together with a team composed of senior supervisors, economists, auditors, lawyers and data scientists, he set up in 2018 and implements since then an integrated approach to supervise small banks, combining supervisory technology and a (revisited) proportional touch. Since 2021 he represents FINMA in the Basel Consultative Group of the Basel Committee on Banking Supervision (BCBS), with a focus on suptech and proportionality developments.

Alain Girard joined FINMA in 2015 in the resolution directorate and represented FINMA in the creditors' committee of a bankrupt bank. He had previously worked in competition policy and as an attorney in private law firms. Alain Girard is an economist, a Swiss-qualified lawyer and holds a doctoral degree in law from Fribourg University and a LL.M. from the Humboldt University of Berlin.
